Move To A Three Year Reappointment Cycle: To Change Or Not To Change, That Is The Question?? (60 minutes) Co Presenters: Todd Sagin, MD, JD Janet Wilson, BS, FMSP, CPMSM, CPCS	The Joint Commission recently revised their medical staff standards to allow for a three year schedule While many in the industry review this change as favorable, there are a multitude of decisions that must be made before this change should occur. In this program, we will discuss the pros and cons of transitioning to a reappointment period of three years, and discuss the regulatory, accreditation and governance document factors that will need to be evaluated and considered.
Getting Your Reappointment Ducks in a Row (60 minutes) Presenter: Cris Giles or Cris Mobley	Thinking of changing your reappointment cycle to 3 years based on new TJC/ACHC standard updates? Not to fast. There are factors to be discussed, weighed, and a plan to follow for reaching the decision to implement. We’ll discuss the pros and cons that should be considered and with who, other regs to be considered and making sure all the “ducks” are aligned before moving forward.
Are you Up to Date?? Accreditation Standards Updates for 2023 (60 minutes) Presenter: Janet Wilson	There have been some updates to Accreditations Standards that affect our industry. During this session we will highlight and discuss the recent updates and compliance requirements.
Mitigating Risk for Patients and Health Centers/Hospitals through Quality Credentialing (90 minutes) Presenter: Cris Mobley	Credentialing/privileging is not just an exercise in paperwork! A well-organized process following accreditation standards and state/national regulations is essential to ensuring health centers are recruiting well qualified individuals who will provide safe and quality patient safety care to your patient population. This session will provide key documents to be collected and evaluated, identifying “red flags” and tips to avoid any unnecessary risk when adding and re-credentialing practitioners to your staff.

<p>Speak Up – It’s Your Job – identifying and addressing Red Flags (90 minutes) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>It’s one thing to collect data related to an application or reapplication. It’s another to be able to identify some of the “flags” raised when assessing that information once received. The more you experience you have processing files, the more you develop a “sixth sense” to know there’s something not quite right. This session will identify common and uncommon red flags that should be addressed and steps to take depending upon the nature of the information received.</p>
<p>How are you doing? Is it Time for an MSP Happy Hour?? (60 minutes) Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>This has been an exhausting year in our industry. Our workload has increased and we have had to learn new ways to do our jobs and support our leaders. Our stress is at levels some of you may have never experienced. Question.....how are you managing your stress? Have you found ways to balance your life in this new environment? Let’s discuss and share ideas on how to get through these times together and celebrate our achievements.</p>
<p>Ignore, Manage, Report?? How do you address physicians who resign with red flags? (60 minutes) Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>Do you have physicians who resign with red flags in their file you are tracking/trending? Do you have a policy that requires you review/address red flags before allowing the physician to resign? Is there language in policy or bylaws that will not allow a practitioner to reapply for membership/privileges if they resigned with outstanding red flags in their file? Lets discuss best practices to consider.</p>
<p>Aspire Higher – Stepping up to Leadership (60 minutes) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>Want to be a leader? Intimidated by leadership? We’ll explore leadership positions that are within reach and how to get there. What are the fears associated with leadership roles? You too can learn to speak in front of others. We’ll discuss the plan for leadership roles internally and externally (e.g., state associations)</p>
<p>VERIFY AND COMPLY: Credentialing across the Spectrum of Hospitals, Surgery Centers and Managed Care (3 hours) Presenter: Janet Wilson</p>	<p>Janet is the co-author of HCPro’s Verify & Comply: Credentialing, Medical Staff, and Ambulatory Care Standards. In this program she will share a comprehensive comparative review of all regulatory and accreditation standards. This program also helps support those MSPs currently seeking NAMSS certification and supports professional development for those experienced in the industry seeking updates to their resources and knowledge base.</p>

There is often confusion as to what’s required and what is done to supplement the requirements. Unfortunately, an increasing number of physicians who are terminated by the employer (HR) for behavior or clinical quality problems are allowed to move freely to another practice with no concurrent or subsequent medical staff peer review action. We will discuss ideas, options and regulatory opportunities for a collaborative approach to peer review for employed physicians.</p>
<p>Navigating Physician Aging and Physician Re-Entry – Tricky but Doable Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>There are fewer and older physicians practicing today. Some have retired but coming back. An interesting dilemma in these times. Discussion will include potential associated risks with both, address policies that need to be in place, share valuable resources to assist organizations in assessing competency levels and review some actual case studies.</p>
<p>Credentialing Committee Vetting of State Medical Board Information: Applying the Right Diligence (60 minutes) Co Presenters:</p>	<p>This session will highlight the importance and value of querying information from a state medical board in a manner which yields necessary information. In many cases it may not be sufficient to simply confirm whether an applicant has an active license. Attendees will learn that state medical boards are variable in the speed with which they post actions against licensees, the completeness of the information posted, the length of time in which they keep</p>

<p>Avoiding Negligent Credentialing – Tricks of the Trade (90 minutes) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>No one wants to read about their organization in the headlines for a negligent credentialing lawsuit. So, how do you avoid credentialing risk in your organization? Understand why a rushed appointment can come back and bite you, differentiate between well written and vague privileging criteria, and other practical tips plus discussion of actual case studies from an expert witness.</p>
<p>Fortifying the Relationship: Provider Enrollment and Credentialing Presenter: Chris Giles</p>	<p>Discussion will include enrollment and credentialing and lack of relationship and explore the affect of automation on both processes. We will identify the shared data items that support both and look at the advantage of streamlining and data sharing.</p>
<p>On-Boarding – So Many Ways, So Little Time (60 minutes) Presenter: Cris Mobley</p>	<p>How many avenues do practitioners have to enter your system – locum tenens, temporary privileges, telemedicine practitioners, community based, contract, employed, etc. What is common thread and what outliers do you need to define. Also, what role does recruitment play and where do you fit in?</p>
